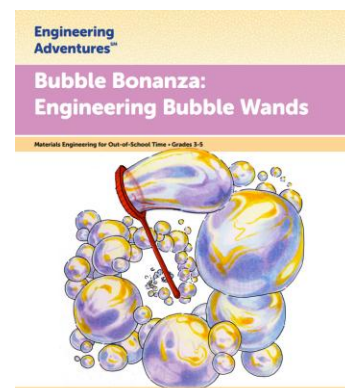

## Bubbles Bonanza; a STEM Curriculum for Out-of-School Time Programs

AzCASE is excited to share a new STEM curriculum specifically designed for the out-of-school setting: **Bubble Bonanza!** The units in this program allow youth in grades 3rd - 5th to engineer their own bubble wands and explore science through the fun of bubble blowing. This program is designed to help youth develop 21st century skills by enriching creative thinking, exploration, and problem solving abilities.

Bubble Bonanza was developed by the Engineering is Elementary team and is available for use in two formats: free instructor guides and material kits for purchase use with 24 participants. The instructor guides include preview pages with materials and preparation information, an adventure guide with step-by-step instructions for the facilitator, and one engineering journal for kids.
