

Active Schools Acceleration Project Acceleration Grants

Deadline: April 22, 2013

The ASAP Acceleration Grants campaign is giving schools across America everything they need to launch a new physical activity program, including seed funding, a plan to follow, and a support network of champions across the country embarking on the same path.\$1,000 will be awarded to 1,000 across the country to start to start one of the following programs: 100 Mile Club, BOKS, or Just Move.

National Storytelling Network Brimstone Award Deadline: April 30, 2013

This fund supports projects that promote understanding of the ways storytelling can promote change in individuals and communities. Grants of \$5,000 will be awarded in support of storytelling projects that are service-oriented, based in a community or local organization, and replicable in other places and situations. Areas of interest include health care, environmental education/activism, community development, law, multicultural awareness, organizational development, leadership, intergenerational initiatives, empowerment of the disabled, substance abuse prevention, and educational curriculum at all levels.
