

MetLife Foundation Partners in Arts Education grants aim to improve teaching and learning in the arts by promoting exemplary partnerships between community arts education organizations and public schools. Awards of up to \$20,000 are given to specifically support partnerships that: exemplify best practices in creating and sustaining effective arts education partnerships; demonstrate joint design and execution of programming, curricula, professional development, and evaluation; provide high quality learning experiences that address national, state and/or local arts education standards; and serve significant numbers of public school students during the school day or extended day.

Small, Rural School Achievement Program Grants

Deadline: May 31, 2013

The Small, Rural School Achievement Program, under the U.S. Department of Education, awards grants on a formula basis to eligible local educational agencies to address the unique needs of rural school districts.

Advanced Placement Test Fee Program

Deadline: June 3, 2013

The AP Test Fee program awards grants to eligible State educational agencies to enable them to pay all or a portion of advanced placement test fees on behalf of eligible low-income students who (1) are enrolled in an advanced placement course and (2) plan to take an advanced placement exam. The program is designed to increase the number of lowincome students who take advanced placement tests and receive scores for which college academic credit is awarded. More information>>

National Endowment for the Humanities Implementation Grants

Deadline: August 14, 2013

Implementation grants from the America's Historical and Cultural Organizations program, administered by the National Endowment for the Humanities, will support the final stages of the preparation of a museum or library exhibition, interpretive Web site, a reading or discussion group, or other projects that

engages people in reflection upon culture, identity, and history.
