Spotlight on School Age:City of Tempe Kid Zone Enrichment Program

Youth voice and choice are a top priority in Kid Zone! Every day, the kids have access to both staff- and youth-led programs, covering a wide variety of fun, educational and hands-on activities, including STEM, literacy, arts and culture, sports, nutrition, character education, service learning, and even money management.

By the Numbers:

City of Tempe Kid Zone Enrichment Programs serve 2800 youth during the school year, and 1000 during the summer. Attendance is \$223/month during the school year and \$120/week during the summer. From June '15-May '16, DES subsidies provided 225 youth with access to this high quality out-of-school time program!
