Last month, AzCASE sent the 2015 Arizona Out-of-School Time Survey to every candidate running to serve as Mayor or on the City Council in Pfhoenix and Tucson asking about candidate support for their city's OST program, as well as how they plan on supporting and promoting youth programs in their city.

The City of Phoenix's PAC program and the City of Tucson's KIDCO program are both large, cityrun and city-wide OST programs that primarily serve thousands of low-income youth and families. They are instrumental in ensuring that afterschool opportunities are available to all.
