A diverse group of stakeholders-including educators, business and industry, policy makers, and parents-agree that computer science education is vital for kids to become the creators and innovators for the next generation, making technology work for them and designing solutions for their communities.



Afterschool Alliance asked the OST field what they thought about computer science

education-and responses showed overwhelming interest! Almost 60 percent of respondents currently offer computer science to their students, or had offered it in the past. Despite this strong interest, OST providers indicated some big challenges to offering computer science to their students, especially finding qualified educators to teach it, securing funding, and accessing necessary technology.

Year Up Opportunities for Youth

YearUp Arizona is seeking 80 youth for its upcoming cohort. YearUp is an intensive, one year program for young adults 18-24 combining hands-on skill development and internships at the nation's top companies, emphasizing valuable hard and soft skills training. Youth in the program can earn up to \$600 per month and 30 college credits while participating. 85% of YearUp's graduates are employed in a YearUp related professional field and/or attending school at program completion and their average beginning salary is \$36,000 per year.
