CocoNuts release FTC results

The CocoNuts Robotics Team from Coconino High School in Flagstaff, AZ is the 1st robotics team of its kind in Northern Arizona. Since its founding in 2007, the CocoNuts have been recipients of prestigious awards such as the Inspire Award, Engineering Inspiration Award, and Regional Chairman's Award.

The Coconuts spend countless hours working in their community to spread excitement of FIRST Robotics, mentor younger FIRST teams in Flagstaff, teach a robotics curriculum, run a summer robotics program, and host the Arizona FIRST Tech Challenge Championships.

On January 18, the Coconino High School CocoNuts hosted 28 teams at the Arizona FIRST Tech Challenge Championship Tournament. The CocoNuts have been instrumental in the growth and quality of the FIRST Tech Challenge. When they began hosting FTC in 2009, there were only eight teams in Arizona. This year, the program contained 42 Arizona teams and 10 New Mexico teams.

The Inspire Award winning team is given to the team that serves as a role model for all FTC teams. This year, the winning team was team 5661 EFHS SHPE from Estrella Foothills High School in Goodyear.

The CocoNuts plan on competing for the Regional Chairman's Award again this year. They have received the Award four times in their six year team history. The winners of the Regional Chairman's Award will travel to St. Louis in April to compete for the Championship Chairman's Award.
