

The End of Bullying? Breaking the Gender-Labeling Habit Early



The Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education recently published a report entitled Guidance for Massachusetts Public Schools Creating a Safe and Supportive School Environment, which serve as guidelines for nondiscrimination on the basis of gender and/or gender identity.

The report cites the need for schools- as well as afterschool and out-of-school time programs- to provide all students with a safe and supportive environment in which to grow academically, developmentally, and socially. The goal of such guidelines is to enable administrators, faculty, staff, and students to **create a culture in which all students, regardless of gender-identity,** feel safe, supported, and included.

Says columnist Sheryl Boris-Schacter of applying Massachusetts' guidelines to our own programs,

A good place to begin is for us to rethink common elementary school practices of labeling and sorting children by gender, because those behaviors both contribute to the stigma experienced by transgender students and reinforce detrimental stereotypes for all children.... We need to contribute positively to change by altering school-based practices that inadvertently limit the ways in which children see their worth, define their interests, and construct their identity.

Funding Opportunities

Enhanced Assessment Grants Program Deadline: July 8, 2013 Award: \$9.2 million

The purpose of this program is to enhance the quality of assessment instruments and systems used by States for measuring the academic achievement of elementary and secondary school students. The Department is holding a competition to support the development or enhancement of a kindergarten entry assessment that is aligned with the State's early learning and development standards and that must cover all of the essential domains of school readiness. We will give priority to early learning collaborative efforts among States (collaborative efforts) in developing this assessment. More information>>

Juvenile Justice Information Sharing & Technical Assistance Grant Deadline: July 9, 2013 Award: Up to \$175,000

This initiative aims to enhance the ability of the juvenile justice, child welfare, mental health, and education systems to share information that will facilitate the provision of services and ensure better outcomes for children, youth, and families. OJJDP will deliver training and technical assistance services to build state, local, and tribal capacities to implement solutions to address this nationwide need. OJJDP will build the capacity of juvenile justice, child welfare, mental health, and education systems and use existing information sharing standards, procedures, tools, and practices across agencies to improve services and outcomes for youth, families, and communities.

Head Start University Partnerships Deadline: July 26, 2013 Award: \$400,000 - \$500,000

This grant solicits applications for Head Start University Partnerships to support projects that will examine the role that Head Start can play in promoting family well-being, including health, safety, financial security, and school readiness. Projects must be led by researchers working in partnership with one or more Head Start programs. Examples of the types of services of interest include, but are not limited to: sectoral employment initiatives or other intensive employment services; or workforce readiness skills, family language and literacy (including English classes for non-English speakers), mental health services, and domestic violence services. Results of these studies are expected to provide valuable information that can help guide programs in their decisions regarding strategies for improving parent well-being in ways that will ultimately result in positive child outcomes. Youth Engagement, Education & Employment Program Deadline: July 31, 2013

Award: Varies

This grant from Fish and Wildlife Services aims to provide experiential, education, and employment program opportunities for youth of all ages (pre-K through early adult life, including students, associates, fellows, interns, members, and volunteers) to participate in conservation activities conducted by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and/or in collaboration with other DOI bureaus; other federal agencies; and other non-Federal entities. Disability & Rehabilitation Research & Training **Program Grant** Deadline: August 6, 2013 Award: Up to \$875,000

The purpose of this program is to plan and conduct research, demonstration projects, training, and related activities, including international activities, to develop methods, procedures, and rehabilitation technology that maximize the full inclusion and integration into society, employment, independent living, family support, and economic and social self-sufficiency of individuals with disabilities. Planning Grants for America's Historical & **Cultural Organizations**

Deadline: August 14, 2013 Award: Varies

Grants will support the development of a museum or library exhibition, interpretive Web site, a reading or discussion group, or other projects that engage people in reflection upon culture, identity, and history. Organizations classified as taxexempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, local and state government agencies, and federally recognized American Indian tribal governments may apply.
