Apply Today For a STEM Mini-Grant from AzCASE & Cox Communications!



The Arizona Center for Afterschool Excellence and Cox Communications invite afterschool programs statewide to apply for one of ten \$1,500 grants to create new or expanded STEM-based learning in afterschool or summer programming.

The goal for this grant is for afterschool **staff AND** youth to **brainstorm** what might be done using Science, Technology, Engineering, and/or Math concepts to solve **real world** questions and problems. These issues should be relevant and of interest to the children and youth in the afterschool program. W are looking for hands-on, project-based learning, and a project that allows youth to design, build, and test their ideas even if their original concept doesn't succeed.

Eligibility:

Afterschool and out-of-school programs serving youth ages 6 to 18 are eligible to apply and must submit a grant application with a full description and budget of their planned use for the funds by Friday, September 6, 2013.

ALL grant proposals MUST describe how the STEM grant funding will be used and the educational benefits derived. Grants will be awarded statewide to programs based on their creative and innovative use of age appropriate technology or proposed STEM-based projects for the intended afterschool audience.

REPORT: The Importance of Afterschool In Minority Communities



The Afterschool Alliance recently released a brief entitled The Importance of Afterschool and Summer Learning Programs in African-American and Latino Communities, which describes the important role afterschool plays in providing students with academically enriching and fun activities, healthy meals, and a belief in their ability to accomplish anything they put their minds to, especially in African-American and Latino communities.

The brief looks at Census Bureau and Department of Education data, national household surveys, and polling and research reports and finds that these communities are experiencing higher levels of poverty, homelessness and food insecurity, and are facing disparities in education and access to extracurricular activities. Yet despite the considerable need and demand for afterschool and summer learning programs in African-American and Latino communities, afterschool programs serving these groups are struggling to meet demands.

The Afterschool Alliance proposes a **greater investment in afterschool and summer learning programs in minority communities** in order to meet the demand for these programs and make certain all children are able to take advantage of the services and supports they have to offer.

REPORT: The State of STEM Afterschool Programming in Chicago



The Chicago STEM Pathways Cooperative has released the first comprehensive city-wide survey and analysis of STEM opportunities in Chicago afterschool and out-of-school time programs. The report identifies the breadth of programs and gaps in service and recommends better citywide coordination and expanded outreach to underrepresented communities.

The State of STEM in Out-of-School Time report establishes a road map to enable diverse youth to become- and stay- involved with STEM experiences from kindergarten through college. Despite the diversity, energy, and availability of Chicago's existing STEM and out-of-school time programming, the report found that there is a lack of coordination, a common language, and a clear set of goals. Of most concern, Latino students were underrepresented in programs relative to their population in Chicago Public Schools.

Funding Opportunities

Head Start University Partnerships

Deadline: July 26, 2013 Award: \$400,000 - \$500,000

This grant solicits applications for Head Start University Partnerships to support projects that will examine the role that Head Start can play in promoting family well-being, including health, safety, financial security, and school readiness. Projects must be led by researchers working in partnership with one or more Head Start programs. Examples of the types of services of interest include, but are not limited to: sectoral employment initiatives or other intensive employment services; or workforce readiness skills, family language and literacy (including English classes for non-English speakers), mental health services, and domestic violence services. Results of these studies are expected to provide valuable information that can help guide programs in their decisions regarding strategies for improving parent well-being in ways that will ultimately result in positive child outcomes.

Youth Engagement, Education & Employment Program

Deadline: July 31, 2013

Award: Varies

This grant from Fish and Wildlife Services aims to provide experiential, education, and employment program opportunities for youth of all ages (pre-K through early adult life, including students, associates, fellows, interns, members, and volunteers) to participate in conservation activities conducted by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and/or in collaboration with other DOI bureaus; other federal agencies; and other non-Federal entities. Disability & Rehabilitation Research & Training Program Grant

Deadline: August 6, 2013 Award: Up to \$875,000 The purpose of this program is to plan and conduct research, demonstration projects, training, and related activities, including international activities, to develop methods, procedures, and rehabilitation technology that maximize the full inclusion and integration into society, employment, independent living, family support, and economic and social self-sufficiency of individuals with disabilities.

Planning Grants for America's Historical & Cultural Organizations

Deadline: August 14, 2013

Award: Varies

Grants will support the development of a museum or library exhibition, interpretive Web site, a reading or discussion group, or other projects that engage people in reflection upon culture, identity, and history. Organizations classified as tax-exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, local and state government agencies, and federally recognized American Indian tribal governments may apply.

- Increasing access to summer meals programs supported through the Summer Food Service Program or the National School Lunch "Seamless Summer" Program
- Educating and enrolling more eligible families in SNAP/WIC
- Increasing the availability of Universal School Breakfast through alternative models such as in-classroom breakfast and grab-n-go
- Advocacy around any of the above anti-hunger issues
