Feeding Children After School: The Expanding Role of USDA Child Nutrition Programs

USDA has a long history of subsidizing school meals through the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) and the School Breakfast Program. Increasingly, USDA is also involved in feeding children after school, especially low-income children. Participation in the after-school snack component of the NSLP is rising, and an after-school meal option for at-risk children, administered through USDA's Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP), was extended to all States in late 2010.

TUSD Considering Fee Increase for Extracurricular Activities

Tucson Unified School District students who participate in after school sports could have to pay more to play. Currently, fees are set at \$50 per sport or activity for high school students and \$20 for middle school

students. The fees for high school sports would go from \$50 to \$65 and from \$20 to \$30 for middle school sports. Before any fees are raised, TUSD wants to hear from those affected and they will be several meeting.

Students measure enzyme reaction rates in a biotechnology class at Flowing Wells High School on Friday. The schools at Flowing Wells are too clean. The doors stay open too long. Those are the main findings of the state Auditor General's Office, which spent a year poking and prodding this small north-side district where a quarter of the students live in poverty and 71 percent are on free or reduced lunch.

26 States and DC Submit Applications for ESEA Flexibility Waivers

Last week 26 states and the District of Columbia met the second deadline for states seeking No Child Left Behind (NCLB) <u>flexibility waivers</u>. The Department of Education launched the waiver process last fall as a way to give states a certain amount of flexibility from the mandates of the 10-year-old NCLB law in exchange for states' implementing standards and accountability reforms. Of particular interest to supporters of afterschool programs has been the optional 11th waiver allowing 21st Century Community Learning Center (21stCCLC) funds to be used to lengthen the school day, week or year.

Youth Baseball & Softball Program Funding

Deadline: April 1, 2012

The Baseball Tomorrow Fund, part of Major League Baseball, awards on a quarterly basis after a thorough and selective application process. The application evaluation process takes three-to-six months, which depends upon the date that the letter of inquiry is received. This funding is intended to provide funding for incremental programming and facilities for youth baseball and softball programs, not for normal operating expenses or as a substitute for existing funding or fund-raising activities. The program generally considers projects that include capital expenditures for youth baseball and softball programs such as baseball/softball equipment and uniforms, basic baseball/softball field renovations and construction (e.g. infield mix, sod/seeding, bases, dugouts, fencing, field lighting, irrigation system, grading, etc.)
