#### Let the Vetting Begin!



In fall 2012, responding to requests from afterschool providers, funders and policymakers, the Arizona Center for Afterschool Excellence and the Valley of the Sun United Way assembled a **diverse statewide committee** charged with creating a **quality framework for enrichment and expanded learning programs** serving children and youth across Arizona.

The committee, led by AzCASE and VSUW, was comprised of a **balance of stakeholders** from key sectors: youth development program providers, policymakers, state agencies, schools and districts, funders, advocacy organizations and others.

For the past seven months, the committee has:

- Researched and analyzed best practices of quality standards from other states and in the field of youth development
- Deliberated the vision and goals desired in developing standards leading to better outcomes for children and youth
- Agreed to a definition of common terms and key values
- Interviewed diverse stakeholders
- Completed multiple rounds of drafting, reviewing and refining standards, and
- Developed effective adoption and advocacy strategies

After seven months of research, careful deliberation and consensus, a draft of Arizona's proposed Afterschool Standards will be **available for public vetting and comment** beginning next week!

Afterschool providers and youth advocates interested in reviewing and vetting the proposed standards are asked to contact Melanie McClintock at <u>mmcclintock@azafterschool.org</u> to **request a copy of the standards** and the process for submitting formal comments on what has been proposed. The deadline for public vetting is **June 30, 2013**.

## **Funding Opportunities**

#### Zero Robotics STEM Summer Opportunity Deadline: May 8, 2013

Award: \$1,200

The Zero Robotics Summer SPHERES Competition is a fun and flexible summer STEM program for middle school students. Over the 5 week program, participants will work in teams to learn about computer programming, robotics and space engineering while gaining hands-on experience working with and coding SPHERES (Synchronized Position, Hold, Engage, Reorient Experimental Satellites). The program culminates in a tournament where each team's SPHERE satellite will compete for spots to operate and race one another on the International Space Station. At the end of the summer program, participants will get to see SPHERES in space via a live feed and have a conversation with Space Station astronauts who "referee" the race! More information>>

## ING Run For Something Better School Grant Deadline: May 15, 2013

Award: \$2,500

## USA Funds- Key Transitions & Postsecondary Education Initiative

#### Deadline: May 24, 2013 Award: \$400,000 - \$800,000

USA Funds will award grants to three organizations for programs that support recent high school graduates, adult learners transitioning into a postsecondary education environment, and students transitioning between the first and second year of college, particularly at the community college level. Qualified programs must primarily serve high school seniors or undergraduate students from USA Funds target populations, including students from low-income households, students who are the first in their family to attend college, and students of color.
