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

New Literacy Tool Available for Afterschool Programs



The Arizona state legislature recently passed Move On When Reading, which states that students with insufficient reading scores (far below third grade level) on the AIMS test will not advance to the fourth grade. These changes will take effect next year (school year 2013-2014), meaning that first graders in the 2011/2012 school years will be the first group of third grade students to be effected by this legislation.

It is commonly thought that students need to learn to read

before the fourth grade so that they can thereafter read to learn. While afterschool program staff are not meant to be "reading teachers" or "literacy coaches," afterschool programs can play a role in promoting literacy and contributing to a child's reading fluency and comprehension.

The Connecticut After School Network has developed *Literacy Strategies After School*, a **400-page compilation of 50 different strategies** and lesson suggestions for increasing literacy with students in grades 1-6. Developed specifically for use outside of the traditional classroom, these strategies are aligned with the **Common Core State Standards**, and include extensive samples and resource lists.

#### KidsCare Coverage Expanding to Accept More Kids



The City of Phoenix recently announced that <a href="KidsCare">KidsCare</a>, a statewide low-income children's health insurance service</a>, will be expanding to accept enrollment through 2013. AHCCCS, which administers KidsCare, announced that the income limit has been raised, allowing families to make up to two times the federal poverty level (about \$47,000 a year for a family of four) and still be covered by KidsCare.

While **funding for KidsCare is temporary** through 2013,

<u>Kids Health Link</u> in Maricopa County and <u>Nuestra Salud</u>

(Our Health) in Southern Arizona are available to help families apply for KidsCare now and to transition into the new health insurance marketplaces that are being created under the

<u>Affordable Care Act</u> in 2014.

Children's Action Alliance has updated their health manual, <u>Health Care</u>
Resources for Arizona's Low Income and Uninsured Families, to reflect the many changes in Arizona's health care.

# **USA Funds- Key Transitions & Postsecondary Education Initiative**

Deadline: May 24, 2013 Award: \$400,000 - \$800,000

USA Funds will award grants to three organizations for programs that support recent high school graduates, adult learners transitioning into a postsecondary education environment, and students transitioning between the first and second year of college, particularly at the community college level. Qualified programs must primarily serve high school seniors or undergraduate students from USA Funds target populations, including students from low-income households, students who are the first in their family to attend college, and students of color.
