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

# Quality Program Self-Assessment: The key to positive youth outcomes



The Arizona Center for Afterschool Excellence and the Valley of the Sun United Way will formally launch the Arizona Quality Self-Assessment Tool (AzQSAT) next week in conjunction with the national Lights On Afterschool celebration. The AzQSAT is a new online resource for

out-of-school time programs that directly aligns with the Arizona Quality Standards for OST Programs.

Once launched, the AzQSAT will allow programs to create their own accounts giving them access to use the tool to measure their program's quality in the same seven focus areas outlined by the Arizona Quality Standards. The new software will also score each program's performance in the seven focus areas and provide specific resources that a program can then use to

# Mott & OST Support National Initiative

**Every Student, Every Day:** A National Initiative to Address and Eliminate Chronic Absenteeism was just launched to support President Obama's My Brother's Keeper Initiative with coordinated community action that addresses chronic absenteeism affecting millions of youth each year. With a diverse coalition of local stakeholders working together to engage and support students who are chronically absent, youth and family outcomes of entire communities can be dramatically improved.

The Charles Stewart Mott Foundation will support this new national initiative to prevent chronic absenteeism with up to \$1 million, helping incorporate OST programs as part of the solution.

Research shows that participation in quality afterschool programs can create a continuous quality improvement plan. A proposed quality improvement plan template will also be available online.

## **American After 3PM STEM Report**

At a time when many experts are concerned that U.S. students are not prepared for a changing economy



that relies on STEM,most parents in AZ say
OST programs should provide opportunities to
explore and engage in hands-on STEM
learning, according to a household survey
commissioned by the Afterschool Alliance.

The Afterschool Alliance released a special report, Full STEM Ahead: Afterschool Programs Step Up as Key Partners in STEM Education, which found broad support among AZ parents for providing STEM learning in OST. However.
