Arizona Named a 'Top 10 State for Afterschool'

Arizona was ranked a "Top 10 State for Afterschool" based on the largest national household survey ever conducted to gauge parent satisfaction and support for afterschool programs.

The Afterschool Alliance's *America After 3PM* survey put Arizona as No. 6 in the nation based on responses indicating that 97% of Arizona parents are satisfied with their child's afterschool program and 84 percent of Arizona parents support public funding for afterschool programs.

America After 3PM revealed that 178,554 children in Arizona participate in an afterschool program, yet 318,223 children would be enrolled in a program if one were available to them.

California was the top-ranked state followed by Washington, D.C., Florida, Vermont, Massachusetts, **Arizona**, Oregon, Nebraska, Tennessee and Hawaii.

AzCASE Professional Development Survey Results Are In

In September, AzCASE conducted a survey of Arizona out-of-school time programs on the topic of professional development. We were thrilled to have more than 300 programs respond, giving us a deeper understanding of the professional development offerings currently available to OST programs across the state. Here are a few key highlights from the results:

- * The majority of respondents indicated that they participated in professional development on a monthly (30%) or quarterly (28%) basis
- * The majority of respondents attended professional development trainings (74%) and most of their programs covered the expenses (92%)
- * The majority (75%) of respondents indicated their programs host professional development trainings internally
- * The topic most addressed in respondents' internal trainings was 'Social and Emotional Development' (62%)
- * 45% prefer in-person trainings over other formats like one-one coaching and webinars
