This article from Edutopia highlights an inventive program -- The DREAM Factory -- that gave children the opportunity to create their own chocolate bar company. This included "learning how to design the chocolate bar, creating the mold for it, pouring the chocolate, designing a company logo, creating a business plan, creating company business cards, and finally creating a 30-second commercial marketing the chocolate bar and the company." Though many programs cannot afford a 3-D computer to create their own chocolate bar molds, this activity is an excellent example of a STEM project that is intentional (see Out-of-School Time Quality Standard III), that is cross-curricular, and that is actually fun! We hope it will inspire you to create your own entrepreneurial project!
